

Help your child to pronounce the letter sounds correctly. Here's a useful website:

Play 'Find things beginning with...'  
e.g. 's': soap, sandals, socks, sun cream...

**Phonics Workshop**  
Phase 2 ideas

Keep sharing books together

Use magnetic letters (or letters written on little bits of paper) to make simple word strings e.g.

top, mop, pop...

cat, bat, hat...

Sound simple words out as you speak to your child:  
"Would you like some t-oa-st?"  
"Come and give me a h-u-g"  
"It's time for b-e-d"
