
CEDAR GROUP






ROWAN GROUP

CHESTNUT GROUP

Chestnut group have had a very busy term! Our topic for the first half term was Sun, Moon & Earth. In literacy, we read Whatever Next! By Jill Murphy and used colourful semantics to describe what happened on each page of the text. We created lots of art work based on the moon and had sensory play with moon dough! We also learnt some facts about the sun and Earth and enjoyed identify-

ing different wonders of the world.

We also had lots of fun during Multicultural week, painting African masks and then dancing to the beat of the drum! This half term we chose China as our country

from Asia and learnt about the Great race and the twelve animals that became part of the Zodiac calendar. As part of book week, we read the story of Handa's surprise. We commented on which animals took which fruit using SVO's and were able to taste some of those exotic fruits as part of our cooking session. Happy Holidays - The Chestnut team.

WILLOW GROUP

In Literacy, we have been learning how to write captions. We have been looking at different pictures that relate to the topics and made short sentences to describe the picture.

We then moved on to learning about adjectives, looking at more pictures to make descriptive sentences. Most the children worked on describing with colours and then progressed to using more detailed adjectives such as big or small etc. We also continue to work on hand writing skills, phonics, punctuation and reading. In Numeracy, we started the term learning about different coins, we mainly focussed on 1ps and 2ps but some children were able to recognise higher coins and were able to label them. We then moved on to 3D shapes. We



learnt the names of the shapes, looked at different objects in the environment, handled 3D shapes and matched them to symbols and experimented to hand out which shapes roll or stack and which shapes did both. Some children were able to look at the vertices and faces of the shapes. In Science, we looked at gravity and started off with learning about planets in space. We learnt the names of the planets and looked at how we could

tell them apart. We made the solar system in Art and put it up on the display board. We learnt a little bit about space and about what gravity is. We are now learning about solids, liquids and gases.


In PSHE, we have been learning about relationships. We have had to focus on identifying who are girls and who are boys for a couple of weeks as some children struggle to understand that some girls have short hair and some boys have long hair. We learnt different family members and compared the differences between everyone in the class. Willow group are all doing well. Well done Willow group.

BIRCH GROUP

The students from Birch have had a productive term. Our English focused on Information Texts where the students produced fact files based on different countries. The students also learned about the features used to write a diary extract and used this knowledge to create their own diary accounts. Birch class maths focus this term has concentrated on the number operations of multiplication and division, where they learned how to apply a range of formal methods to solve calculations involving these operations. They also revisited areas such as place value and how to solve word based mathematical problems. This terms topics covered 'Continents and their Countries' and 'The Victorians', where the students developed

their understanding of the world by learning about what countries are located in the different continents, while finding other various facts, such as what geographical features (Mountains and Rivers) are found in

these regions. When learning about 'The Victorians' the students used a range of sources to find out about the life of Queen Victoria, what Victorian schools were like and famous Victorian inventors. Our science themes focused on 'Gravity' and 'Changes of State'. The class took part in a range of investigations that focused on looking at the effects of different forces such as air resistance, water resistance and friction, focusing on how different forces acted against each other. When learning about 'Changes of State' the students investigated reversible changes by heating and cooling chocolate and finding out what materials are soluble and insoluble. In supporting the development of the pupils' social skills, various opportunities were organised for the students to visit various local cafes, where they ordered their own drinks and food and engaged in group conversations while enjoying their meals. REDWOOD GROUP

This Spring term Redwood were working hard developing their knowledge about Sun, Moon and Earth. We have been working on extending our vocabulary, especially by grouping and naming. We have been exploring the meaning and sounds of the new words. Redwood Class enjoyed the Multicultural Week which took place between 15th - 19th of January.

A big focus has also been on understanding personal safety in the community. The students have been developing independent living skills like looking after themselves and preparing food. They have been visiting a variety of shops where they

could practice their social skills. In Numeracy they have been practising sorting items by type, function, colour etc. They have been practising shape and



money skills both in the class and out in the community. Redwood have been learning about the importance of personal hygiene and tooth care. In PSHE we have been learning about feelings and emotions and different ways of dealing with them. We would like to wish everyone a Happy Easter.



POPLAR GROUP

Poplar class has had a brilliant but very cold term. In literacy we have been looking at different stories; looking at what the characters might be thinking or might say at different parts of the

story. We have also been working on our punctuation, looking at full stops, commas, apostrophes and question marks. We have been very busy in maths learning about multiplication, money and preposition and direction words. The students in Poplar have been using toy money to pay for their snack at snack time to gain experience of handling and exchanging money.

In science we have been looking at changing states. We have looked at different solids, liquids and gasses. We have done lots of experiments in cooking changing the states of ingredients like chocolate, butter and batter. We also talked about reversible and irreversible changes by melting crayons and cooking toast.

In topic we have been learning about Victorians. We have learnt what

Victorian schools were like, what sort of jobs Victorian children had and Victorian inventions.



BFFCH GROUP



This term the children in Beech class have learned about organising different objects and China. Together the class celebrated Chinese New Year with party poppers, glitter cannons and traditional Chinese toys. In cooking sessions the boys have been practicing making toast,

In humanities, we learnt about Chinese New Year, different religions from around the world and the weather.




In Maths, we continued to develop our number skills by engaging in activities relating to counting sums and using numbers in familiar contexts.



School makes a lot of additional demands upon your child. If they are not well, they are unable to cope with the demands of a school day which can delay them getting better. In fairness to other children and staff, please keep your child at home if you suspect they are unwell.

If the school is not informed, you will receive a phone-call/text asking you to contact us and inform us of the reason of absence.
